New Arrivals at Morning Star

Anita is a fourteen year old who has been in an orthopedic clinic for close to a year. Complications in surgically correcting birth defects stemming from tuberculosis caused her to lose her right leg. She was fitted with a prosthetic and upon her release from the clinic came to Morning Star. Her family is not able to care for her and now that she is over the TBC, returning to the family shack where both her father and grandmother are sick is not an option. Late one afternoon a couple of weeks ago, residents in one of Chiclayo’s residential districts noticed bundled up blanket on the sidewalk near a park. Once they realized there was a newborn baby inside, they notified the authorities and she was taken to the hospital. The family court judge called us a few days later to take custody of little Abigail (as we’ve named her). She’s in perfect health, has a fantastic appetite and growing fast. As the courts sort out her situation, she’ll be loved and cared for here at Morning Star.
