

## News of some of the Lord's work in Northern Peru

March at Morning Star is a whirlwind of activity as most of the children return to school. Uniforms, school supplies, backpacks & lunch boxes all must be brought current and schedules adjusted. Thirteen of the eighteen children study off campus, some in the morning shift and some in the afternoon at various locations. In the midst of all this the local authorities decided they would do construction and renovation at the 3 public kindergarten school in our town sending the principals scrambling to find locations in which to have



classes a week before the start of the school year. The kindergarten that Morning Star children attend is one of them and we ended up agreeing to loan them 4 classrooms for both the morning and afternoon shifts, so once again the campus is full of little kids during school hours.



Little Derhek has been with us for just over a year during which time he has been placed on the adoption roster. He came to us from the city of Trujillo having been abandoned by his HIV+ mother at birth. We praise the Lord that he is perfectly healthy! His new family will likely come for him this month so please pray for a smooth transition and strength for our house parents to endure his departure.

Our other one year old Claudio, is awaiting the judge's ruling so

he can also be put on the adoption register. Waiting for very busy magistrates to get around to issuing rulings can be frustrating, but we are trusting in the Lord's timing for him and his future path.

We are thrilled to see the Lord at work in each individual He brings our way and for all those who support the ministry here with their prayers and giving.
