On Thursday the 21st we welcomed the most recent arrival at Morning Star. Alexandra will turn 6 in November. Her unfit mother lost custody of her when she was less than a year old and she was placed in the other children's home nearby which specializes in infants and toddlers. We have received many transfers over the years when the children reach this age. Alexandra has never experienced a family home and she readily fit right in with our group of girls her age and older. Although she is supposed to be on the adoption roster, there are procedural issues with her sentencing paperwork which we hope to be able to resolve so she can finally be adopted by a loving family. Please pray with us as we seek to break up the legal logjam and get her case moving again.



Friday the 29th we had another X-Ray taken of Franco's leg. There is still no healing at the fracture site and the surgeon's recommendation is that we continue to pray and wait. Reminiscent of Elijah on Mt. Carmel praying for rain...we ask you to join us in pressing on at the throne of grace that the Lord would cause his bone to begin the healing process and not have to submit him to more surgery or in the final case...amputation.

Many of our adolescent teens are of course struggling with interpersonal dynamics which are amplified when living together 24/7 in close quarters. Please pray for wisdom in guiding them through their personal growth.

Several of our children also must deal with the uncertainty of their connection to their biological families who are under investigation and yet visit them on occasion without being able to predict if or when they will regain custody. Waiting patiently upon the Lord is a difficult lesson to learn especially at a young age.

Praise the Lord with us that two of our girls, Natty (12) and Rosalinda (11) accepted Christ as their Savior this month. Please continue to pray for Camila, Ana, Marisela, Dayana, Yensy, Keyla and Ester, all who have such difficult histories to overcome and have yet to be born again into new life in Christ.

We are very thankful to the Lord for your prayers and interest in the ministry in this little corner of the Lord's kingdom.
